**III. Report of the University President or Provost**

President Hopkins

Public Campaign Launch Highlights - October 18<sup>th</sup>

- Less than 20% of University funds come from the State of Ohio and Ohio is 42nd out of 50 states in state support per FTE in the funding of higher education. We are working hard to make needed changes in the next budget, but in the meantime Wright State has to think more like private universities in terms of fundraising.
- For the last few years we have been quietly raising money on behalf of the university for scholarships, student success initiatives, endowed chairs and professorships, supporting programs and academic excellence
- Leadership/Quiet Phase – we have raised \$108 million of the \$150 million goal; the largest campaign in the history of Wright State.

- Tom Hanks is the National Honorary Chair of Wright State's public campaign.

- For the first time in the history of Wright State, ten alumni have committed a million or multiple million dollars to the campaign, ten couples, friends of the university, and fifteen corporations have committed a million or multiple millions to the campaign.
- The campaign will be public for the next two to two-and-a-half years with the intent to finish above the \$150 million goal.

#### Mini-Campaigns

- There are twelve public mini-campaigns to raise funds for the colleges, archives, veterans, and athletics.
- Mini-launches in nine different cities across the United States where a significant number of Wright State graduates live. Cities include Washington DC, Tampa, Houston, Los Angeles, New York City, Chicago, Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati.

Associate Vice President of Facilities Management & Service Dan Papay was called to the floor to brief the Senate on the issues that lead up to the resolution, including water, maintenance and special project costs, the attraction of mosquitos & geese and their associated externalities. Questions were raised regarding student and alumni views of the moat and VP Papay mentioned that the student government representative at the Building & Grounds meeting enthusiastically supported the issue. VP Papay also stressed that the resolution on the floor is not to remove the moat but to encourage the University to look into alternatives, which would then be brought back to the Senate.

1. B.S. Business, Major in General Business (RSCOB/LAKE)

Faculty Vice President Loranger asked a question regarding whether or not Lake had the faculty to adequately deliver the 66 hours of major courses in the program. Senator Bukovinsky (RSCoB) clarified that the delivery will be addressed in a number of different ways: the Provost has approved the hiring of an additional faculty member to be hired, Lake Campus has approved additional sections to meet student demand, main campus RSCoB faculty will be teaching the upper-level courses via IVDL classrooms, and the resource requirements can be spread among all RSCoB departments due to the degree being classified as general business and not a specialized area of study.

Faculty VP Loranger followed up with an additional question regarding the title for course MS 2040 listed as “Introduction to Business Decision Making” when the course is listed in the catalog as “Introduction to Business Statistics”.

A motion was made to amend the program to reflect “MS 2040 – Introduction to Business Statistics”.

The amendment was unanimously approved.

The amended item was unanimously approved to be considered as Old Business at the next Senate meeting.

C. Hybrid/EV Parking Lot 7 (B&G / Parking)

The Parking Services & Traffic Appeals Subcommittee & the Building & Grounds Committee have approved a request to install 5 Hybrid/EV designated parking spaces in Lot 7, which will allow Wright State to increase its Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design (LEED) Certification for the New Classroom Building project from the Silver to Gold level.

Senator Garber raised questions regarding other alternatives to receive LEED certification points that would enhance access rather than restrict access. Senator Garber then requested that Building & Grounds have reviewed other non-construction options for the next Senate meeting.

The item was unanimously approved to be considered as Old Business at the next Senate meeting.

## VII. **Written Committee Reports and Attendance**

### A. Budget Priority Committee (Dr. Rizki)

The budget committee recently held its first meeting and was briefed by the administration regarding changes to the proposed MDA model. The model is radically different than what was presented last year, which suggests that we need to go through an education process and thus VP Polotajko has been asked to give a presentation at the next Senate meeting. Senator Garber clarified that the “radical change”, in his opinion, was better than previous iterations of the MDA model.

Dr. Wischgoll, Chair of the IT Committee briefed the Senate on the upcoming timeline to transition from the Luminus Wings Portal to a Drupal-based portal. As part of this transition Course Studio will be eliminated as an option and that Course Studio users will need to transition to Pilot courses starting Summer 2015. Senator Doom and Faculty President Rizki raised concerns regarding the communication of the transition and the burden that the transition will place on faculty. Scott Rife, Associate Director of CaTS, and Terri Klaus, Staff Director of CTL, reviewed the costs associated with the current system and indicated that CTL would be able to replicate Course Studio functions within Pilot and assist faculty in the transition.

In closing, Faculty President Rizki stressed that there needs to be serious effort by CaTS & CTL to communicate to the faculty at-large, not just the Senate IT Committee, regarding the planned changes and to have a transition plan that includes an announcement, an educational process, and training.
