

Memorandum of Understanding  
Wright State University

To serve students and embrace the spirit of a quality, affordable education, we hereby establish a Memorandum of Understanding for CCP Students and Policy 3103.

The recent Flexibility/Guidance for Secondary Schools and Colleges & Universities published by ODHE states that students with an unweighted high school cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 can be eligible to participate in CCP. Given this guidance WSU is temporarily waiving the second bullet point found in Policy 3130.02 regarding CCP application: Students that meet the 3.0 GPA requirement are not required to submit ACT/SAT or ACCUPLACER test information to be considered for participation in CCP when they apply. This waiver is in effect for students applying for Summer 2021 through Spring 2022 terms.

**3130.3 Applications**

Applicants must:

- Complete Wright State's online College Credit Plus application by May 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the fall of the year of intended enrollment.
- **Submit high school transcripts and official ACT/SAT scores to Wright State. If no ACT/SAT scores are available, ACCUPLACER tests are required.**

As of June 1, 2018, ODHE requires that Wright State University only accept ACT, SAT or ACCUPLACER tests. ODHE sets the threshold scores required for admission.
